

Dear Parents/Carers,

Re: Coronavirus update Year 10 – school closure to most pupils

Following on from my last update, I'm now writing to let you know that **we have now been instructed to close the school to almost all children after this Friday 20th March until further notice.**

As advised by the government, we will do all we can to stay open for the children of key workers (e.g. NHS staff, police, others in frontline services) and children who are classified as vulnerable. The audit has already been shared with you to inform the school of your need if you fall in this category.

All other children will need to stay at home, so we ask that you do not send your child into school from Monday 23rd March onwards.

What we'll continue doing while your child is at home

Our advice is to try to follow the published school timetable to ensure the continuation of a broad and balanced curriculum. Your child's learning is of course important to us, so we'll continue to help your child to learn; where possible teachers will be available during the time that the lessons are delivered. Teachers will respond to messages via the google classroom, but please be patient as our capacity will be limited due to continued staff shortages.

- 1) Lessons will be posted on **Google classroom** which may include tasks to complete on other learning platforms.
- 2) On the school website under the **COVID-19 tab**, you will find an outline of the work that each department is setting as well as any **additional materials** that have been given to your child.

Our expectation is that all students complete the set work during this time to reduce the impact of the lost learning time.

If your child usually receives free school meals the local authority is working with the government to facilitate this. Once this provision is clear, it will be communicated to you.

We understand that this latest news will have an impact on you and your family and it's far from ideal, but we'll continue to keep in touch with any updates as the situation develops. Please refer to the **COVID-19 tab** on the school website which will be regularly updated as appropriate.
